How many of us have heard of the Sherpas? Native to the mountainous regions of Nepal, they are highly regarded as elite climbers, guides and porters for climbing expeditions in the Himalayas. They always carry the heaviest loads and pay the highest human costs for eking out an existence on the roof of the world. One such Sherpa was Tenzing Norgay who guided Ed Hillary to the top of Everest in 1953. Tenzing once said that in the mountains worldly attachments are left behind and that in the absence of material distractions we are opened up to spiritual thought, that we should be attempting to carry the spiritual experience of the mountains with us everywhere. Heroes are just ordinary people who do extraordinary things in the business of everyday living. As Canadian author Barry Finlay writes in "Kilimanjaro and Beyond": Every mountaintop is within reach if you just keep climbing...

On this our Feast of All Saints, the Beatitudes of Jesus illustrate a very similar lesson in heroism. However strange they may seem to modern ears, there is nothing at all ironic about the blessings that Jesus bestows on those who dare to be different! In the biblical tradition, a beatitude is a declaration or recognition that certain individuals or classes of people are in a happy circumstance. The basic idea is not too far away from what we do when congratulating a person on some achievement or good fortune: graduating, getting a job, getting married – even winning an election! In a religious sense, beatitudes are spoken in respect to those seen to be in a good situation because they have been "blessed" by God. But Jesus isn't piling on pious platitudes here! For the ordinary people of Jesus' time and place, whose everyday lives were an uphill climb for survival, the beatitudes not only acknowledged their very real vulnerability and disadvantages, but were a way of congratulating them in advance for the blessings that would eventually be theirs in the future. Far from being a tight, prescriptive list of moral musts or a foolproof recipe for success in conventional terms, the Beatitudes are simply the way by which we can claim the love that the Father has lavished on us already, our measure of holiness as an act of Christian heroism in a less than ideal world. To use a play on words, the Beatitudes present a positive attitude for being to keep us grounded in reality as we scale the heights of Christian virtue. Every mountain top is within reach if you just keep climbing.... As indicated in John's vision of the victorious multitude who follow God and the lamb in our second reading from Revelation, today's feast calls to mind not only those whom the Church has officially recognized as saints but all those whom we have known and loved whose personal examples continue to influence us even now. In our own community, many unsung heroes can be numbered amona those whom Pope Francis has called "the saints next door." As we continue to scale the mountain that is COVID, how best can we witness to the Beatitudes at this time? Are we able to rise above ourselves to help guide others to the summit of the Kingdom, as missionary disciples? Now seated on that mountain where heaven is wedded to earth, the saints are able to do so much more for us and share so much more with us in the presence of God than all that they did and shared with others whilst they lived. No matter how steep life can be at times, we can draw inspiration from their lives of faith and love, as we ourselves continue the struggle to be faithful and loving members of a listening, praying and servant community of saints-intraining. Kia mau ki te kupu a tou matua – let us hold fast to the words of your ancestors, for our reward will be great in heaven. Saints of God pray for us....

Blessed are the poor...not the penniless but those whose heart is free. Blessed are those who mourn...not those who whimper but those who raise their voices. Blessed are the meek...not the soft but those who are patient and tolerant. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice... not those who whine but those who struggle. Blessed are the merciful... not those who forget but those who forgive. Blessed are the pure in heart...not those who act like angels but those whose life is transparent. Blessed are the peacemakers...not those who shun conflict but those who face it squarely. Blessed are those who are persecuted for justice... not because they suffer but because they love. (theologyofwork.org, A Modern Version of the Beatitudes)



PROLIFE FACTS

Poland's abortion-rights activists and Leftist groups have reacted furiously to a recent ban on abortions on eugenic grounds. Some churches have been vandalised and public Masses invaded by shouting protesters. The trouble started following a cross-party parliamentary petition to the Constitutional Tribunal, seeking a ban on abortions performed on eugenic grounds. The Tribunal ruled that aborting babies with Down syndrome or physical disabilities is inconsistent with Article 38 of the Polish Constitution which provides every human being with legal protection of life. Article 30 was also cited which reads: "The inherent and inalienable dignity of man is the source of human and civil freedom and rights. It is inviolable and its respect and protection is the responsibility of public authorities." In New Zealand, the preborn child has no rights, as he or she is not considered a human person until actually born. Consequently, abortions are routinely performed to terminate the lives of preborn babies identified as having Down syndrome or other disabilities. For more information on pro-life issues, visit
