In June 2010 I stayed for a fortnight at an old Franciscan Friary in Italy for an international retreat for Priests, Deacons and Seminarians connected with the Focolare movement. There were at least a hundred of us from around the world, all attempting to live the movement's spirituality of unity through acts of love in a common life. Not so easy when you don't know a single word of Italian or Spanish and your school-boy French is a bit patchy! I'll never forget my first night at Vinea Mea. After getting off the train from Florence, I'd been picked up at the local railway station in Incisa and was sitting down to dinner when I met David Rider. He'd just arrived from New York and was about to start studying at the North American College in Rome. Apart from being one the nicest people I have ever met, David is also one of the world's best tap dancers. A dancer since the age of 3, he'd opened a school of dancing in his teens and had even gone on tour with a professional troupe across America and Japan. Nowadays Fr David is a priest of the New York Archdiocese. Fr David is one of those rare individuals who use their everyday gifts and talents to connect with many different people on levels that would be far more difficult to bridge otherwise! To build a bridge means to find common ground in the face of difference. Pope Francis says that bridges are made by God with the wings of angels that people may learn to communicate. If we build walls or borders to separate ourselves for fear of the "other", we end up being inmates in prisons of our own making. Until we cross the bridge of our insecurities, we can't begin to explore our possibilities. As it says in a Welsh proverb: if you want to be a leader, be a bridge...

John the Baptist was very much a bridge builder himself. As one lone voice crying in the wilderness, John fulfills the vision of Isaiah to prepare the way for the Advent Christ. In our Gospel, Luke sets John's bridge building in an historical context that isn't so different to our own. Building on Baruch's vision of Jerusalem's restoration where he portrays Jerusalem as a mother welcoming back her lost children from all directions, John's baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins means nothing less than to remove all obstacles of sin that we ourselves put up like traffic barriers, that lie in the way of Jesus coming to us, where we are. To make every path straight, to fill every valley, to lay every mountain low and to make the rough smooth means not to conquer a physical landscape but to reshape the inner landscapes of the human mind and heart. That all humankind shall see the salvation of God.

So what does God's salvation look like for us? In his letter to the Philippians, Paul writes from within the "bubble" of his imprisonment with joy, praying that their love for each

There are times in life when we are called to be bridges, not a great monument spanning a distance and carrying loads of heavy traffic but a simple bridge to help one person from here to there over some difficulty such as pain, fear, grief, loneliness, a bridge which opens the way for ongoing journey When I become a bridge for another, I bring upon myself a blessing, for I escape from the small prison of self and exist for a wider world, breaking out to be a larger being who can enter another's pain and rejoice in another's triumph. I know of only one greater blessing in this life, and that is to allow someone else to be a bridge for me. (Joy Cowley)

other may increase more and more. Paul was very much like our Bishops who call us to care both for the vaccinated and unvaccinated alike, at this present time. As we come back together again after our time in the wilderness of lockdown, may we overcome the divisions that Covid has caused and exposed. As we prepare an Advent way for the Lord to lead us out of isolation to enjoy the freedom of renewed life in community, may the one who has begun this good work in us see that it is finished when the day of Christ Jesus comes. The way of Advent is not a destination but a journey, a way of love that reaches out across difference, a way of building bridges across the gulfs of uncertainties to touch hands, hearts and souls in the experience of union. As we prepare for Christmas, all we can do is build a bridge and get over ourselves! If you want to be a leader, be a bridge, not a wall.


