We cannot do as much as we used to; Our movements are restricted now, and slow:

a tranquillity which we find has a worth beyond

anything we have experienced before.

Our years seem to pass more quickly than when we were young;

We remember the phrase "the fear of God" yet, with our ageing, we have come to understand

that its true meaning is our awe of God, our reverence for Him.

There is nothing to frighten us about the possible imminence

with the fragility of our body -- perhaps with some pain,

discomfort, inconvenience --

we learned that there is nothing to fear from God, about God.

So it is, that we sense in our minds and often feel in our bodies,

by God who is the Heart of Peace

It was He who, at the very beginning, made us

so wondrously and gave us the superlative gift life itself!

He gave us all the magnificent intricacy of our body to
