Has anyone noticed how much the North Island looks a lot like a giant stingray? According to Māori legend, the North Island of New Zealand is known as Te Ika a Maui – 'Maui's fish'. Maui was much admired for doing many impressive things. But he wasn't too popular with his brothers! One day they decided to leave him behind whilst they went fishing. Maui overheard them chatting, and secretly made a fishhook before hiding under the floorboards of his brothers' canoe. Once the canoe was far off-shore, Maui jumped out from under the floorboards and threw his fishhook over the side of the canoe. Suddenly, he felt the hook touch something, and it dug in fast. With the help of his brothers, Maui hauled the fish to the earth's surface. But before he could ask permission from the God of the Sea, his brothers began to carve out bits of the fish – which are the mountains, lakes, valleys, and rocky shorelines of the North Island. Even though this story isn't literally true, it contains a deeper, underlying truth as we mark this Waitangi Day. This wonderful land was gifted to us by those who were willing to leave behind the familiarity of home to launch out into the unknown for the sake of something better. In the words of the great Italian explorer Christopher Columbus: *You can never cross the ocean unless you have courage to lose sight of the shore.*

Which is something that Simon-Peter also had to learn. In our Gospel, he and his brothers have just spent the whole night fishing. Washing their nets, they have to face the very raw and humbling experience of failure. They've worked hard all night long and have caught nothing. Given that they weren't even listening to Jesus speaking to the crowds on the shores of the lake in the first place, Jesus' command to Simon-Peter and the others to put out into deep water to pay out their nets again for a catch must have seemed strange! But what Simon-Peter didn't know was that Jesus was about to transform failure into freedom. The enormous catch of fish that Simon-Peter and the others made in response to Jesus' command was overwhelming. No wonder Simon-Peter was brought to his knees! As in the calling of Isaiah, Simon-Peter embraced his new vocation to catch people instead of fish with the painful awareness of his great unworthiness. Just as Isaiah's lips were purged of impurity, Simon-Peter's fear was replaced with faith. The great responsibility that Jesus called Simon-Peter to assume would demonstrate God's power working through him, not despite of but because of his very human frailties. Simon-Peter's willingness to launch out into the deep was reflective of God's own faith in him personally. Jesus didn't call Simon-Peter because he was perfect but because he was utterly real. Great moves of God are usually preceded by simple acts of obedience. You can never cross the ocean unless you have courage to lose sight of the shore.

Here are working men with hands that are calloused not consecrated. They are used to the burn of ropes, sweat and smells of fish, fraying nets and the squinting worry of work. This time they are the ones caught, though they try to close their eyes, like fish, they are lidless and they are seen. Somehow they are known by this stranger who smells like blood on wood. (Joseph Ross, DISCIPLES, 2013)

As Paul's very personal witness to God's mercy in 1 Corinthians shows us, the only way for us to cross the ocean of life and faith is through being as open to conversion as Paul was! He writes that he is the least of the Apostles, that he was born at a time when no one expected it. But by God's grace that is what he is, and his work has not been fruitless. When it comes to facing our frailties, can we regard them in the same forgiving way that God does? What nets of negativity and unhelpful attitudes must we cast aside to freely follow the radical call to discipleship without reserve? Are we as willing to take the risk of engaging with "the other" in a spirit of partnership and dialogue as Jesus was with Simon-Peter? To acknowledge and heal our nation's chequered history? As we celebrate our national day to remember the Treaty that was signed at Waitangi to make us one people, Jesus' call to launch out into the deep means so much more than the mythical tale of Maui's fish. To be fishers of people now means to persevere in commitment to the Gospel we have received and in which we are firmly established. Do not be afraid. Do not be satisfied with mediocrity. Let down your nets for a catch.

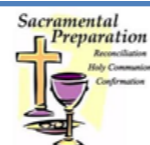

PROLIFE FACTS An estimated less than 20 New Zealanders have undertaken assisted suicide by 20th January 2022, made legal by the End of Life Choice Act. An Irish study published in February 2021, commissioned to assist legislators consider a bill to legalise euthanasia, found that the "Wish to Die" is most often linked to loneliness and depression. However, there were improvements in wellbeing if the person was diagnosed and received counselling. The Wish to Die (WTD) fluctuated if the (mainly older) person didn't feel so lonely. The study found that most of the people who had a WTD had an undiagnosed depression and were not receiving treatment. Very few people who request euthanasia or assisted suicide are sent for a psychiatric evaluation. Canadian psychiatrist, Dr Harvey Chochinov, author of books and articles on Dignity Therapy, emphasises that with proper care, the Wish to Die can often be replaced with a Wish to Live. **For more pro-life information, visit voiceforlife.org.nz.**
