TO HEAT OR NOT TO HEAT? TO HEAT?

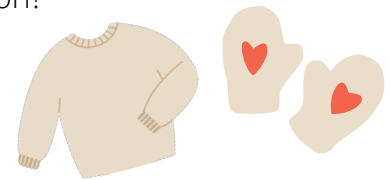
Dear Parishioners

Winter is here. It's chilly in church these days. So should we put the heaters on?

Covid Loves Stale Air

Putting the heaters on means closing windows and doors. And covid thrives in stale recycled air.

The Ministry of Health tells us that St Anne's is a "high exposure place". (See Bulletin 17 April.) I don't like to repeat this, but it is better that we know.



Fresh Air Needed

The MOH also strongly asks us to keep windows and doors open. For maximum fresh air. And to wear masks. We are doing both those things. If the windows are left open while the heaters are on, they soon burn out. That happened to four of the six heaters. They work too hard trying to heat the suburb of Manurewa if the windows are left open. The heaters do not bring in fresh air. They just heat what is there already, and blow it around. Frankly that warm recycled air is unsafe.

What do people say?

I have asked widely for advice from among regular St Anne's church goers. What do you prefer? The Liturgy Committee who organises the Masses were unanimous. Other feedback also overwhelmingly says:

"Keep St Anne's safe"

"Fresh air"

"Keep the windows open. And bring a jacket."

There are many vulnerable people among us – elderly, those with compromised health conditions, those unable to be vaccinated...

So, with fresh air and wearing a mask, let's look after one another.

And wear your warm woollies. We'll get through this. Thanks for your understanding.

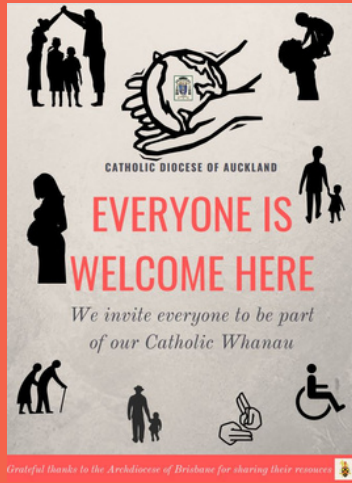
