# Do you find praying and getting into a conversation with God difficult?

I want to share with you this short story by Cardinal Francis Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan (he was imprisoned by the Vietnamese and Communist Government for 13 years).

"After my liberation, many people said to me, Father, in prison you must have had a lot of time to pray. It wasn't as simple as people may think. Time passes slowly in prison, particularly in solitary. Imagine a week, a month 2 months, six months in total silence! There were days when I was worn out by exhaustion and illness that I could not manage to say a single prayer!

This reminds me of a story...There was an older man named Jim, who would go to the church every day at 12:00pm, stay for a few minutes and then leave. The sacristan was curious and asked Jim,

"Why do you come here, every day?" Jim, said, "I come to pray."

The sacristan said "That's impossible! What prayer can you say in 2 minutes?" Jim said "I am an old man and I pray in my own way, and I say, 'Jesus, here I am, it's Jim' and then I leave."

After some years, Jim became ill and went to hospital. When it seemed that he was dying, a priest and a nurse stood near his bed. The Priest said, "Jim, when you came to this ward, everything changed for the

better. How did the patients and staff become happier, more content and more friendlier?"

Jim said "When I could, I would go around and visit everyone, say hello and make them laugh and feel happy and contented." They would say, with Jim around we are always happy and thinking about others, like Jim does. "But why are they happy?" asked the nurse. Jim said "Well, aren't you happy when you

receive a visitor who makes you feel important and you makes you laugh?"
"But Jim," said the nurse, "We have never seen anyone come to visit you?"

Jim said, "When I came here I asked for 2 chairs - one was for you Father and the other for my guest."

"But what guest?" said the Priest.

Jim said "I used to go to church to visit Jesus every day at 12pm. But when I couldn't do that anymore, Jesus came here and visited me. He then says, "Hi Jim, it's Jesus.""

Before dying, Jim smiled and pointed to the empty chair, as if inviting someone to sit down. When I couldn't pray, I said "Jesus, here I am, it's Francis." Jesus replied, "Hi Francis, it's Jesus, I have come to take you home."

So if you find praying hard at present, just sit down and say Jesus, It's me, just wanted to be with you today and let you speak to me....This time is yours"





IIN OUR PARISH... 75

Maryanne Walker (pictured) memories... St Annes my lifelong home parish; my maternal grandparents, Michael and Flora Donelan settled in Manurewa firstly in Massey/Maich Rd, until grandad purchased a 5-acre block in upper Hill Road in 1921, part of the new subdivision of Totara Estate. Grandad, born 1873 in Galway Ireland, a devout Catholic and frequent attendee of Mass, walking the 3 miles (5kms) on the unsealed road; also very handy with his scythe keeping the grass neat around the new church in Weymouth Rd.

Mum Flora, the middle daughter, married Eric Bourdot and they also settled in Hill Road to raise a family of 5; one of her sisters, Kathleen, joined the convent in 1947, Sr Marguerite RSM. My brother Michael, born September 1947 was amongst the first Baptisms in the new parish 75 years ago. When the Convent School opened in 1952 with just 2 classrooms and a roll of 60 our two older sisters attended. Growing numbers in the next decade necessitated Fr Kenefick's garage becoming a temporary classroom where I learned to read and write.

My family were all involved in school and parish life - fundraising, fairs, sports days and picnics at Knock-na-Gree. Legion of Mary and Catholic Women's League for Mum. She was on school lunch roster, and for many years of making all our attire, school blouses and gym slips, shorts and shirts, Communion, Confirmation and debutante dresses, etc. In the mid 70's mum, then a few years widowed, moved to Churchill Ave, backing onto the old school playing field near the church and happily contributing baking and preserves to the presbytery and for many fundraising stalls.

Each of us had left home, one by one, like mum I was the one to settle in Manurewa, marrying Gary Walker at St Annes in January 1973. Our two daughters were pupils of the convent school 1980s and 1990s. In December 1990 wearing a borrowed gymslip I joined the procession from the old school to the new in Russell Road, sharing the leading banner with Robin Belz also an ex-pupil of the Weymouth Rd school.

Daughter Terese went on the altar serving roster when girls were first recruited, both daughters well involved in school and parish activities, including youth group. Dana was married in St Anne's in 2012, Fr Joe Savesi sm officiating, having known him well as Brother Joe in the parish earlier on.

Over the years I have participated in several groups and programmes, also on Parish Council, extending friendships with other parishioners and their families through Marian Mothers and Family Groups (celebrating Mass in the great outdoors of Botanic Gardens on several occasions). It is great to see the generations continuing within the parish, building community over the decades.

Maryanne is currently an enthusiastic member of the Tuesday Knitters Group - Frances Mazur.
