My Faith Journey

It has been more than a year since I first wrote about my faith journey.

I grew up in a Christian family and my parents were devoted to their faith. Prayers and reading the bible was something that I saw them doing every day and I was taught to pray and read my bible which I did.

This went on until I came to New Zealand for further study at 17 years old. This habit slowly disappeared, and I basically focus on my studies at university and other things away from my faith. This went on until I got married at 29 years old.

When I married, I realized for our marriage to last, we need to have Jesus in our life. For me to have Jesus in our lives we need to go back to church. We did go to mass, but we were just visitors meaning we go occasionally to mass.

My husband family through his mother’s side are devoted Catholics. This means that our kids will be raised as Catholics. I had no objection to that because I do believe that when married the wife should follow the husband’s beliefs. However, I was not ready to go through it yet I went with my husband to mass when we managed to find time to go.


Fast forward to 8 years ago after our kids had gone through the sacrament of Eucharist, we came to mass here in St Mary’s and my husband and kids got up to receive the Eucharist and I sat back. After I few times, I made the decision to go through the Sacraments of Initiation.

It has been 7 years since I have become a Catholic. Two years ago, I experienced a dramatic experience in my life that made me realize I need a change. I am into personal development, so I was looking to improve my life and for some reason I discovered this Bible app. This app has a different verse for each day and different subjects where I can choose and learn from. At the time my mind was in turmoil about love and faith. So, I started reading about these in this app. Every morning before I start work, I spend 30 minutes reading from my Bible app and writing about what I read.

Today, I know that I am still a baby in my faith however I want to be a mature Christian. I have asked God to show me my purpose. These days when I wake up, I pray to God to use me in whatever way he wants me to.

My advice for someone out there who is just starting to walk with God in faith:

- Make time to study about Jesus. Read the bible and meditate on his words. Record your time with Jesus by writing it down. I have 2 books (1st book – I write about my understanding of the verse of the day. 2nd book – I write about subjects where I think I needs God’s guidance. I watch videos and read verses in the bible that deals with the subject then record on this book).
- Pray. Pray when happy or when sad.
