Church redevelopment update - 11th June

Dear Saint Mary's Parishioners,

The Site Development Committee are pleased to report that we have submitted a second Application for an Extraordinary Administration to the Bishop of Auckland. As you will be aware from our previous one, we are seeking permission from the Diocese to move forward with our intention to provide a larger more welcoming and attractive space to gather together.

The first time Bishop Steve reserved his decision on the matter until we consulted with the wider Catholic community in South Auckland about our needs now and for the future 10 to 20 years. He was already preparing a Diocese wide discussion of the future demographic changes for the Catholic Diocese in Auckland under the broad hearing of ' reshaping '. You will now be in receipt of his letter of explanation.

The SDC has since spent considerable time in discussion and in researching the demographic projections for Papakura and Drury. We completed this extended due diligence with a Hui at the end of May where we presented our Parish and visitors with a breakdown of the current status of our building plans and options for a larger church and even a possible relocation.

Michael Butler from the CDA who gave a presentation on the projected growth over 20 to 40 years, and the changes we are facing. His talk was excellent, and the power point graphics were eye opening to many.

We think that for those present the true scale of change coming our way was brought into sharp focus.

We used a well proven Decision Analysis methodology at the Hui with produced some surprising results. In short it showed that there was no clear winner out of the four Potential options.

The three front runners were to purchase the neighbouring Wood Street property and rebuilding beside wood street, secondly relocating to a Diocese funded site 2.7 km away at 520 Great South Road and thirdly rebuilding the church on the current footprint.

From the Diocese point of view, it will be reassuring that a sizeable proportion of our Parish are Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament indeed open to change and relocating for the future good of the Diocese. We are also well Fridays 9:30am - 12:00noon aware that there others who feel we should stay where we are. This will not be an easy **PRAYER OF THE CHURCH** decision.

The issues are very complex ranging from EQ compliance to parking problems to Zoning issues and of course that old bogey Money to name but a few.

Our course is now in the hands of the bishop and his advisors. We have presented him with our conclusions and await his wise council. Be assured there will never be any interruption to ongoing Mass at St Mary's for any period. And as yet no decision has been Made.
